Dear Parents and Families.

This week, we are marking Safer Internet Day, focusing on the theme "Too Good to Be True? Protecting Yourself and Others from Scams Online." As technology advances, so do the tactics used by scammers—many of whom are now targeting young people.

Research shows that children and teenagers are more likely to believe online scams, particularly those disguised as gaming rewards, social media giveaways, or messages from seemingly trusted brands. With the rise of Al-generated content and increasingly convincing fake messages, it's more important than ever to teach children how to spot red flags and think critically before clicking, sharing, or responding.

Across the Borough of Bromley, many schools are moving towards *mobile-free environments* during the school day. Studies suggest that delaying mobile phone use until at least 16 can lead to improved concentration, better sleep and stronger social interactions. By reducing screen time, we help children stay engaged in their learning while also limiting their exposure to potential online risks.

We encourage all families to take time this week to talk about online safety—discussing how to recognise scams, question what seems too good to be true and seek help if something doesn't feel right. Together, we can help children develop the skills they need to navigate the digital world safely and responsibly.
