
Prince of Peace,

Please save me when I'm going through a storm and I'm struggling in life. Guide me when we are in darkness. Help us to keep safe when things are falling apart.



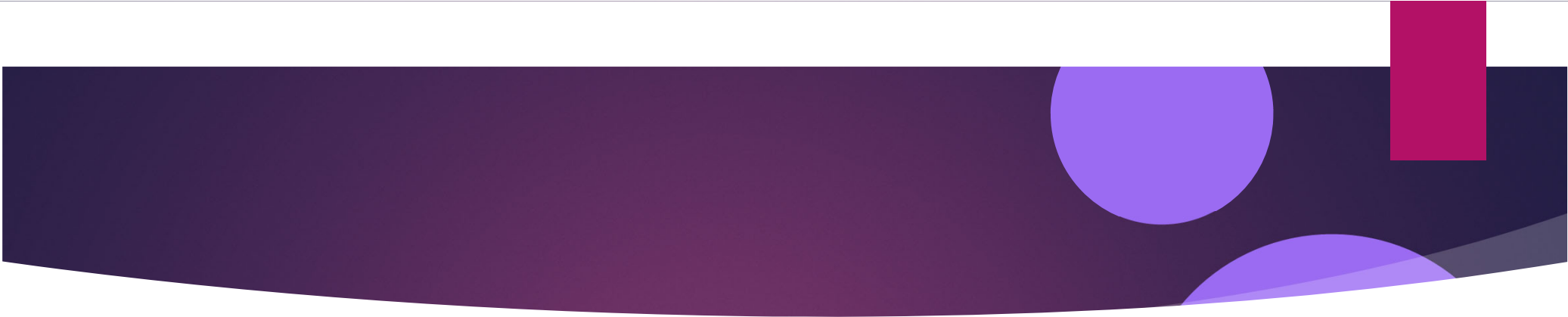




In our opinion, we think the gospel meant that Jesus is the Son of God because he can control the weather and make miracles happen. For example he turned water into wine and he walked on water.

What did the wind signify?




What did the disciples feel like

was occurring?




What did the disciples say to Jesus during the storm?




Dear everlasting Lord and our Lady,

Always remember to have faith.




Your mission for the week is to remember that there will always be a storm but you need to learn how to calm the storm down.




To calm the storm down I


