#### Our Journey through Lent



#### **Book Fair**

We are very excited to be celebrating a love of reading linked to World Book Day with our upcoming annual Book Fair. In the past our Book Fairs have always been a very successful way of acquiring additional books for the school and have also proved to be an enjoyable event for the children.

By purchasing books from the school Book Fair you will be helping us to raise money for each class to spend on a selection of books this year. This means that by supporting our Book Fair you will also be contributing to all classes being able to obtain some excellent, high quality books for the children to enjoy in their classroom and support their learning.

This year the Fair will take place on **Monday 17th**, **Tuesday 18th and Wednesday 19th March** after school from **3.20pm - 4pm** in the computer room. Please use the entrance by the ramp each afternoon, but please wait until the Reception class have been dismissed from this area before entering.

We will only accept cash on the day and unfortunately we will not be able to take any orders this year, so we can only offer the books that are in the cases each day. There is an option to send in money for your child to spend on a book of their own choice on Tuesday 18th March only. Cash must be placed in a named envelope and items that are purchased cannot be exchanged or returned. A member of staff will take your child to visit the Book Fair before the end of the school day to make their purchase.

Every child will receive a £1 World Book Day voucher that can be used towards the cost of a book at the Book Fair or at a participating book store. Some small stationery items are also on offer at the Fair (the voucher cannot be used on these items).
